Join us, as Dr. Harald Stadler, University Professor and former Director of the Institute for Archaeology at the University of Innsbruck, Austria, will present a lecture on the archaeology of World War II in western Austria. Dr. Stadler is a leading authority on the archaeology of twentieth century conflicts in central Europe, particularly on 'glacier archaeology' in the Alps. His lecture will span many projects, including investigations of U.S. and German aircraft crash sites, research on trench art from the forced labor camp at Haiming, archaeology of an execution site in Innsbruck, and efforts to commemorate Allied airmen lost in the Tyrol.
