

Institute of Astro- and Particle Physics of the University of Innsbruck invites applications for

a research position (PhD)

The position is within the framework of the FWF project P26130 (<http://www.uibk.ac.at/eso/>) and is a follow-up to the research of the "in-kind contributions of Austria's accession to ESO" at the University of Innsbruck in Austria (http://www.uibk.ac.at/astro/science_astro/in-kind/index.html.en).

The given degree will be a PhD in Physics (<http://www.uibk.ac.at/studium/angebot/phd-physik/>).

The project with the team leader Stefan Kimeswenger, who is double affiliated with the LFU Innsbruck and the UCN in Antofagasta/Chile), has a Post-Doc position filled by Dr. Stefan Noll. The project deals with the interface of astronomical data reduction and geoscience of the earth atmosphere. Candidates with knowledge in Linux, programming, and astronomical data reduction of ESO data / with ESO data pipelines or MIDAS will be preferred.

The appointment may start with November 2013 and will be for **three years**. Applications including a CV, publication list, two letters of reference, and a brief description of research interests should arrive electronically (pdf < 4 MB) directly at Stefan.Kimeswenger@uibk.ac.at.

The Payment is according to the Austrian national law and similar to that of the FWF national funding agency (see <http://www.fwf.ac.at>) about 1700 Euro / month before tax (14 times - you get in Austria a special half monthly salary every 3 month - a special Austrian "habit"). This gives about 1200 Euro after tax and social security insurance is cut off. Only some minor administrative support for e.g. Visa issues (but no financial support) is provided by our international office.
