Across the great divide (2006)

Nature still reigns supreme as we travel across the Canadian prairie into the rugged Rocky Mountains, and on through remote canyons to the vast Pacific. Travel to the Alberta Badlands and through the ridge of peaks from which rivers run down the three oceans, an area known as the Continental Divide. Running along the top is the massive Columbia Icefields. In a remote corner of British Columbia, the Stikine River winds its way along a spectacular canyon and west through the rugged peaks and thick forest leading to the remote Knight Inlet, about as near perfect as a coastal wilderness can be.

Land of extremes (2006)

Canada's North is a vast canvas of towering landscapes and untouched nature. In these remote, wild lands the struggle for survival is intense. We begin our journey at the freshwater delta off the north coast of the Yukon and go to nearby Herschel Island, a destination for many migrant birds. Later we visit the towering St. Elias Mountains and then on to Nahanni National Park, featuring hot mineral springs, the dramatic Virginia Falls and canyons that slice through the mountains.

The wild shore (2005)

The eastern coastline of Canada, battered by the Atlantic Ocean, is a place where all life fights for a foothold amid vistas of unparalleled beauty. The "barren wastes" of Labrador are deceptive, for there is a wealth of wildlife: polar bear, walrus, caribou and wolves thrive here. Between Labrador and Newfoundland is the beautiful stretch of sea known as iceberg alley. The rugged Newfoundland Cliffs are popular with seabirds, from common murrelets to Atlantic puffins. The St. Lawrence River and the Saguenay, with tributaries that reach far back inland, make a welcome stopover for migrating geese.
