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Why this reflection?

- since our last meeting at Ljubljana DIAMONT gained many new collaborators (in AMGI, EURAC, ifuplan, UIBK/IGF, and UNCEM)
- as the newcomers might not be as familiar with the objectives and mission of DIAMONT as the partners who originated the proposal it might be wise to rereflect some of the basic conceptions of our project
- as things and ideas are changing in the course of time this might be even useful for the "dinosauriers" of DIAMONT
- However, this is not to "fix" original commitments and to deny any progress in ideas and conceptions. In contrary, a re-reflection may help to identify the evolution of our project





Why DIAMONT?

- based on experiences of SUSTALP, RAUMALP/GALPIS and EQO the first idea to help SOIA to install an alpine wide data base and information system in a typical top-down approach
- it was the Alpine Convention which convinced us to think in a reversal way and to help SOIA with on a more bottom-up method





SOIA - DIAMONT

 SOIA deducated its indicators from the ACcontract and the protocols

- participation of the alpine
- population is not foreseen •the indicators might not reflect the preocupations and judgements of people
- DIAMONT uses an inductive-explorative approach, starting with the identification of key questions of Alpine development and the "cultural milieu" of planning and implementation
- •in DIAMONT participation is essential
- •the indicators and instruments must be finetuned by the meanings of people















What means participation?

Participations means the implementation of hopes, expectations and needs of each individual and of groups to the planning and steering process









Participation is

Precondion for sustainable development (social coherence, tolerance, consensus, compensation of interests)

Socialisation communication of people of different social stratas and backgrounds

Exchange of different perspectives, needs and experiences

Extension of horizons Creation of knowledge on the different apects of development

Precaution for the future Future decisions based on participation are better prepared and will be better accepted

Compensation of interests Solutions will be developed respecting different interests.

Social consilience Identification and acceptance will be better

Effectiveness the implementation of measurements may be faster and will be more sustainable


Precaution for conflicts collectively solved conflicts of interests may ward of juridical processes



Publication in newspaper, public notice, public information








Legal framework

- Aarhus Convention on access on information and participation (1998)






Phases of the participation process

Challenges for DIAMONT


- to reach the bottom-up level by participation of citizens and actors in the test regions
- to find/identify good test regions
- to develop a framework of indicators (to identify problems of development and of steering instruments to be discussion in the test regions)
- to find topics of spatial problems worth to be discussed and elaborated in all test regions








Selection of test regions

The moderator


- will not contribute with own statements to the discussion




