The Workshop

The workshop brings together and connects students and teachers from the three Universities in the Euroregion Tyrol-South Tyrol-Trentino, the University of Trento, the Free University of Bozen, and the University of Innsbruck. It offers a unique opportunity to discuss topics related to European integration among peers and supervisors coming from different Universities and disciplinary backgrounds. The regional and subnational dimension, as well as civil society issues will be particularly important.

Selected graduate students will present their research to peers and supervisors receiving constructive critical input for their seminar papers or presentations in the final examination. Students' presentations are to serve as opening acts for broader academic debates on the most pressing political issues of the day in Europe, ranging from the financial and economic crises to the management of refugees. Such interdisciplinary debates are expected not only to broaden participants' perspectives, but also to allow for the emergence of a stronger culture of academic exchange in the Euro region.

The working language of the workshop is English.
