

The University of Innsbruck invites applications for the position of

**University Professor
of Austrian Literary and Cultural History
("Friederike-Mayröcker-Professor")**

at the Research Institute Brenner-Archiv at the Faculty of Language, Literature and Culture and at the Department of History and European Ethnology at the Faculty of Philosophy and History.

It is a position in accordance with § 98 of the Austrian Universities' Act (Universitätsgesetz - UG) and will be based on a civil-law employment contract with the University on the basis of the Salaried Employees Act (Angestelltengesetz). The contract will be concluded for an unlimited period; the extent of employment is 100%.

The newly established position in honor of the Austrian writer Friederike Mayröcker is supposed to combine research and teaching in the field of Austrian Literary and Cultural History in both faculties.

Responsibilities include

The chair-holder is to represent Austrian Literary and Cultural History both in research and teaching with a focus on the 18th to the 21st century.

She/he will seek close cooperation with the units of the Research Institute Brenner-Archiv, the Department of German Studies, the Department of History and European Ethnology, the Department of Contemporary History and both faculties' Research Areas and Doctoral Colleges and also participate in the faculty-spanning Research Area "Cultural Encounters – Cultural Conflicts".

In teaching, the future professor needs to cover the subject area of Austrian Literary and Cultural History with a focus on the 18th to the 21st century on all three levels of the Bologna System (B.A., M.A., PhD) in the relevant courses of the Faculty of Language, Literature and Culture and the Faculty of Philosophy and History. Beyond that s/he is expected to supervise master thesis and dissertations.

Personal involvement in academic administration and self-governance as well as in the department's and faculty's working groups will form another essential duty.

Employment Requirements include

- a) a degree in higher education in Austria or the equivalent abroad, pertinent to the position;
- b) pertinent habilitation in "Neuerer deutscher Literatur" (Modern German Literature) or comparable qualification (e.g. senior lecturer, associate professor);
- c) publications in leading international peer-reviewed academic journals and prominent publishing companies, esp. on Austrian Literary and Cultural History (18th-21st century);
- d) proven competence in historical science (e.g. degree, publications, projects and cooperations);
- e) evidence of involvement in international research;
- f) experience in acquiring and managing external research funds;
- g) pronounced teaching skills;
- h) knowledge of German (C 2)
- i) management skills

Additional

- a) proven competence in interdisciplinary work
- b) innovative teaching methods
- c) experience in supervising master thesis and dissertations
- d) support of established projects
- e) involvement in international cooperations and organization of international conferences and workshops
