

The University of Innsbruck invites applications for the position of a

**University Professor
of
INTEGRATIVE DESIGN**

at the Faculty of Architecture, Department of Experimental Architecture.

The position will be based on a 100% permanent civil law employment contract with the University according to § 98 of the Austrian Universities' Act (Universitätsgesetz – UG 2002) and is to be filled at the earliest convenience.

The professorship is aiming at an internationally distinguished personality in the field of Experimental Architecture who, on the basis of her/his experience, will promote cutting edge disciplinary knowledge in this field.

Integrative design is a method and strategy for understanding complex systems and opening up their design potential. The professorship emphasizes the hybrid character of architecture and its ability to synthesize artistic, scientific, technological and socio-cultural issues.

Responsibilities

The future professor is to represent the subject of “Integrative Design” in both research and teaching. In addition, the professorship will also help to expand the research spectrum within the discipline and to related sciences.

He/she will offer design-based creative and scientific courses in the form of lectures, seminars, design classes and field studies on all three levels of the Bologna System (Bachelor, Master, PhD) as well as supervise final theses in these studies.

Personal involvement in academic administration and self-governance as well as in the institute's and faculty's working groups will form another essential duty.

Eligibility requirements

- a) a degree in higher education in Austria or the equivalent abroad, relevant to the position;
- b) relevant habilitation or equivalent qualification in teaching and research demonstrated by publications and projects;
- c) experience in experimental architecture and transdisciplinary work;
- d) the intention to conduct integrative research;
- e) international scientific experience relevant to the discipline;
- f) excellent teaching skills;
- g) experience in acquiring and managing external research funds;
- h) leadership qualities.

The University of Innsbruck is committed to increasing the percentage of female employees especially in leading positions and therefore explicitly invites women to apply. In the case of equivalent qualifications, women will be given preference.

In line with the Collective Bargaining Agreement professors are in remuneration group A1, i.e., for a full-term professorship the basic salary is 5.245,60 Euro (14 times). Depending on qualification and experience a higher salary and facilities may be negotiated with the Rector. The application should include: a curriculum vitae with a description of the scholarly and professional career, summarised on three pages, and: a list of scientific publications, lectures and other work and projects, including third-party funded projects; a description of completed, current and intended research; a curated selection of the five most important works which communicates the position within the discipline. All documents have to be submitted in digital form (DVD, e-mail, file transfer, etc.), hardcopy (paper) is optional.
