

Brigitte Mazohl, born in South Tyrol, was Assistant Professor of Modern History at the University of Salzburg (professorial dissertation in 1986) following her studies in Salzburg and Vienna (PhD in 1971) and her research activities in Germany and Italy. After visiting professorships in Innsbruck and Klagenfurt she was appointed Professor of Austrian History at the University of Innsbruck (1993), where she has been working since.

Her main fields of study and research within Austrian, German, and Italian history focus on the period between the 18th Century and WWI; she deals in particular with questions of the history of law, administration and politics, governance and communication. Her other fields of research include the history of women and gender studies, educational and intellectual history, as well as the history of historiography.

She was head of department and vice-dean from 1996 – 1999. From 1999 – 2001 she was vice-dean administering exam regulation. Since 2003 she has been a member of the Academic Senate and has been in charge of the History Department of the University of Innsbruck since January 1, 2005.

Brigitte Mazohl is a correspondent member of the Austrian Academy of Sciences and Innsbruck spokesperson of the International Doctoral Program: Political Communication in Europe from Ancient Times to the Present (Universities of Frankfurt, Trento, Bologna, Innsbruck). She is also reporter of the Austrian Science Fund (FWF) for Historical Sciences.
