Please notify us if you wish to use a slide- or overhead projector, or if you want to use our computer for any special application (special software, videos etc.). It will also be possible to connect your computer to the beamer if necessary. Please do not forget your adaptor in case you are a Mac-user.

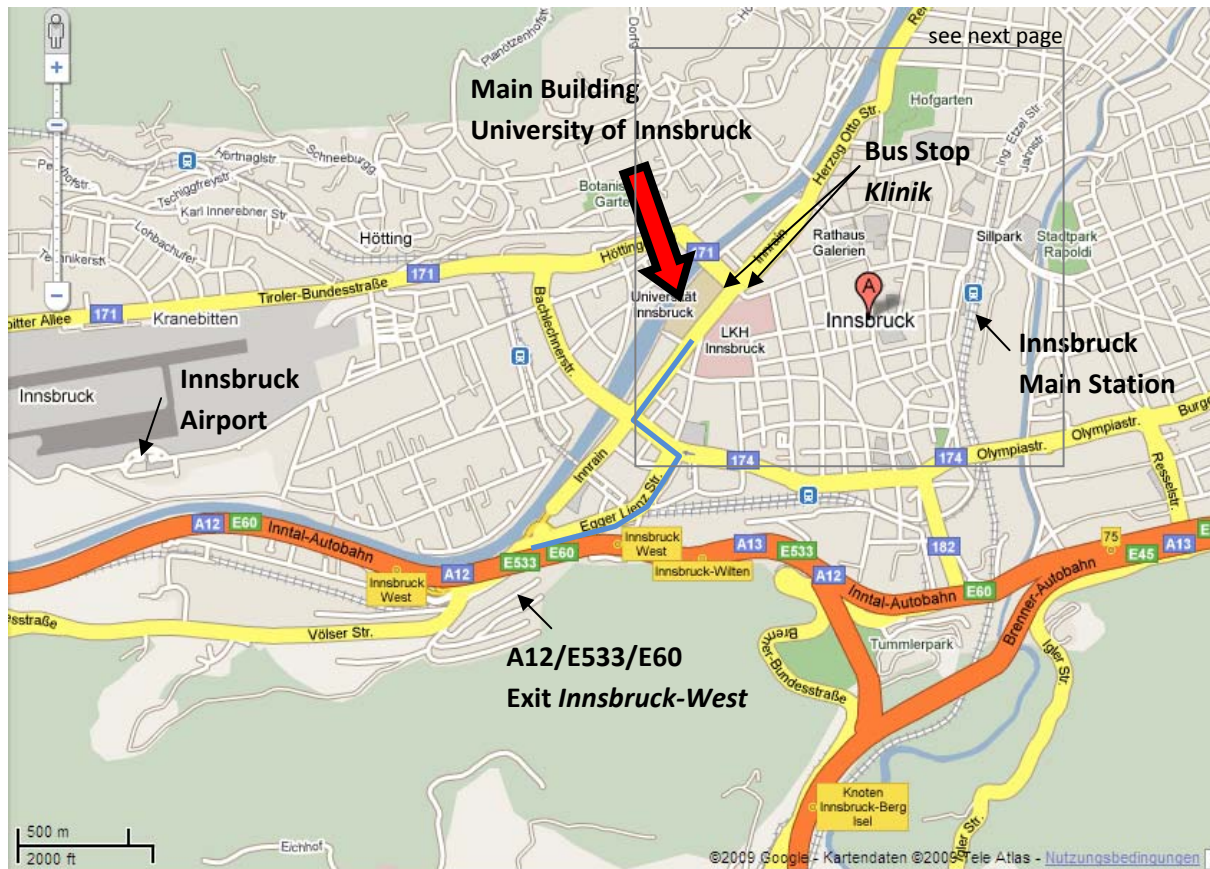

Location

The conference will take place in the Aula of the main building of the University of Innsbruck, Innrain 52, A-6020 Innsbruck. The conference office will be open on Wednesday, Nov. 11, 2009 from 15:00 - 18:00 and on Thursday, Nov. 12, from 8:00 onwards. Opening of the conference will be at 8:30.

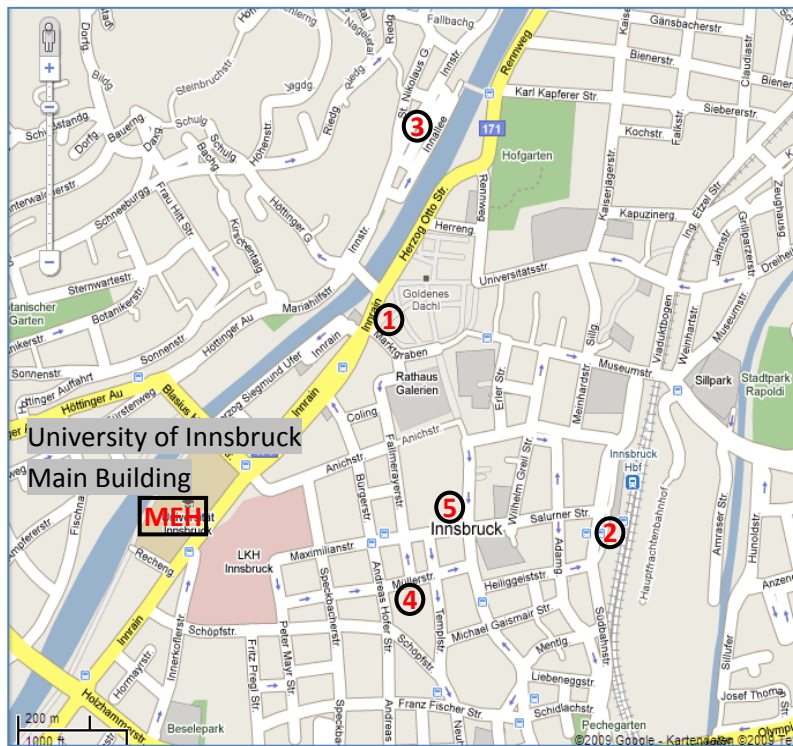

HOTEL ENGL***

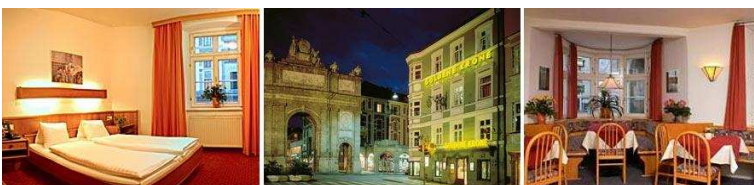
