>> All ERASMUS incomings must be sufficiently competent in German to visit courses and take exams. Academic progress and social integration is not possible otherwise.

>> Summer courses are offered by the Innsbrucker Hochschulkurse Deutsch (IHD), a modul of the LFU International Language Centre.

**Insurance**  
>> EU and EEC students need the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). With this they can go to contractual doctors (see list <http://www.tgkk.at> at "Info Vertragspartner") and are treated free of charge. A prescription for medication is compulsory.

>> Students from other countries are recommended to insure themselves (Freiwillige Selbstversicherung). Confirmation of registration as a resident of Innsbruck and as a student of Innsbruck University are necessary for the application.

### >> NOTE

Courses held at Innsbruck University School of Management, Faculty of Economics and Statistics and Faculty of Political Science and Sociology are restricted to students nominated within valid ERASMUS Agreements in the corresponding subject.

## Assessment and Transcripts

>> Assessment is made either by oral or written exam, usually at the end of semester. Individual assessment may be possible where no exam is provided for Innsbruck students. This must however be arranged with the teacher directly.

1 very good, 2 good, 3 satisfactory, 4 sufficient and 5 failed.
