DIGISOC originates from the AURORA Educational Hub "Digital Society & Global Citizenship," which has facilitated the development of this two-year European Joint Master's Programme (120 ECTS credits). Due to the ambitious and resource-intensive nature of this initiative, an additional project proposal, EURIDICE, has been submitted to the EU call DIGITAL-2022-SKILLS-03. DIGISOC has now been realized based on this call.

Reimagining the Digital Society

The DIGISOC Joint Master's Programme is an European innovative, interdisciplinary two-year programme carried out jointly by

Programme Structure

DIGISOC is a 120 ECTS-credit Master's programme divided into:

YEAR 1

Core Modules:

Cover digital transformation, Al & data ethics, digital rights & governance, societal challenges, and inclusion.

Summer Schools:

Held annually, offering immersive, in-person academic and cultural experiences at partner universities.

YEAR 2

Collaboratorium:

Unique, practice-based modules where students from different disciplines co-create solutions to real-world digital issues in diverse teams.

Electives & Thesis:

Students tailor their study through electives and conduct a final master's thesis under joint supervision.

Who Should Apply?

Ideal for students with a completed Bachelor's degree, interested in digital innovation, social justice, sustainability, and shaping public and private sector responses to the digital age.

Graduates will be able to act as social innovators equipped for careers in tech policy, NGOs, int ernational organizations, research, and beyond.
