Your responsibilities:

- Content creation: You will develop creative ideas for posts, stories and reels from promoting our events to presenting research results in an understandable way in text, images or video.
- Interviews & media production: You will interview our cluster members, moderate in front of the camera or on the microphone, and edit the material into appealing formats.
- YouTube: Together with us, you will establish the EurAsia YouTube channel and fill it with interesting content.
- Networking & visibility: In coordination with the PR departments of the Austrian Academy of Sciences and the universities advertising this position, as well as through contacts with existing podcasts, radio or TV shows, you will help to bring our topics to the public's attention and thus increase the visibility of our research.
