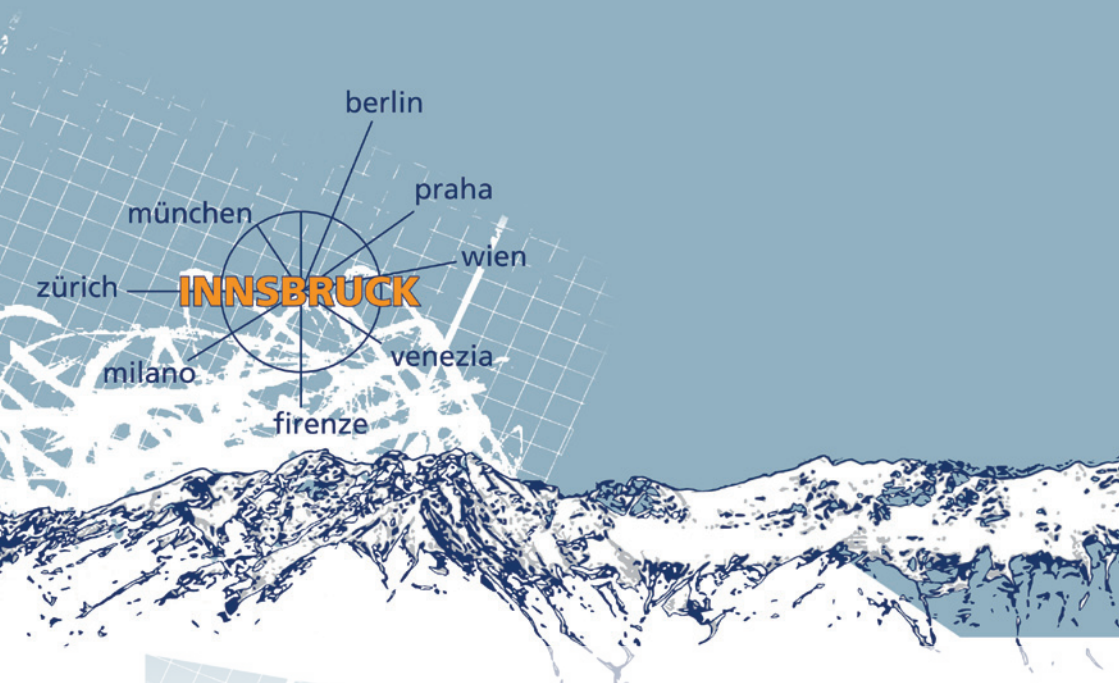

How to Apply

If you wish to study at the University of Innsbruck as an ERASMUS student you should take up contact with the relevant ERASMUS Coordinator at your home university to find out whether a valid agreement exists in your subject area.

After selection by your home ERASMUS Coordinator complete and submit the online Application for Admission:

Your application must also include our Erasmus Certificate with the official stamp and signature of your home Coordinator, a CV (Curriculum Vitae), a copy of your passport and your Learning Agreement

>> NOTE

Please note that the University of Innsbruck does not accept Freemovers and/or non-exchange students

Accommodation

A major concern for ERASMUS incomings is where they are going to live. Accommodation is available for those who apply AND send the reservation deposit.

The rooms are reserved „first come first served“ so please apply as early as possible. Accommodation cannot be guaranteed. It is very difficult and expensive to find private accommodation in Innsbruck.

>> Insurance

EU and EEC students need the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). With this they can go to contractual doctors (see <http://www.tgkk.at> > „Service“ > „Ärzte und Apotheken“ and are treated free of charge. A prescription for medication is compulsory.

Students from other countries are recommended to insure themselves (Freiwillige Selbstversicherung). Confirmation of registration as a resident of Innsbruck and as a student of Innsbruck University are necessary for the application.

All ERASMUS incomings must be sufficiently competent in German to visit courses and take exams. Academic progress and social integration is not possible otherwise.

With financial support from the European Commission and in cooperation with the ISI one German course is offered free of charge to all ERASMUS incomings on different levels during each semester <http://www.uibk.ac.at/isi/>

An online test is necessary to determine your level. Information will be sent to you directly approx. one month before the semester begins.

Participation in the introduction approx. 7 – 10 days before the beginning of each semester is compulsory. Course application and allocation is conducted during the introduction.



Courses

The courses are listed according to faculty and semester. The information on each course includes details on schedule, objectives, contents, literature, type of exam and also registration (if necessary). The choice of courses must be decided upon by the sending institution before coming to Innsbruck.

Courses outside the subject area in the Erasmus Agreement cannot be guaranteed and can only be arranged after arrival.

>> NOTE

Courses held at Innsbruck University School of Management, Faculty of Economics and Statistics and School of Political Science and Sociology are restricted to students nominated within valid ERASMUS Agreements in the corresponding subject area and are not open to other ERASMUS incomings.

Assessment and Transcripts

Assessment is made either by oral or written exam, usually at the end of semester. Individual assessment for Erasmus incomings may be possible where no exam is provided for Innsbruck students. This must however be arranged with the teacher directly.

Grades are 1 very good, 2 good, 3 satisfactory, 4 sufficient and 5 failed.

Each ERASMUS incoming is individually responsible for printing his/her own Transcript of Records before leaving Innsbruck University and returning home.
