

The University of Innsbruck invites applications for the position of a

**University Professor
Of
Manufacturing and Production Engineering**

at the Department of Mechatronics at the Faculty of Engineering Sciences.

It is a position in accordance with § 98 of the Austrian Universities' Act (Universitätsgesetz - UG) and will be based on a civil-law employment contract with the University on the basis of the Salaried Employees Act (Angestelltengesetz). The contract is permanent, with full-time employment (100%).

Responsibilities

The chair-holder is expected to represent the subject of production engineering, both in research and teaching, with a focus on manufacturing.

They are expected to collaborate closely with the faculty's research areas, e.g. with the research center Computational Engineering, and to contribute to faculty-wide research initiatives.

In teaching, the future professor needs to contribute to / cover the subject area of production engineering with a focus on manufacturing on all three levels of the Bologna System (B.A., M.A., PhD) / in the relevant courses of the Faculty of Engineering Sciences.

Personal involvement in academic administration and self-governance as well as in the department's and faculty's working groups will form another essential duty.

Employment requirements include

- a) a degree in higher education in Austria or the equivalent abroad, pertinent to the position;
- b) a relevant habilitation or an equivalent qualification (e.g., Senior Lecturer, Associate Professor);
- c) publications in leading international peer-reviewed academic journals;
- d) evidence of involvement in international research;
- e) experience in interdisciplinary work;
- f) experience in the acquisition and management of competitive third-party funding;
- g) pronounced teaching skills;
- h) management skills;
- i) The ability to teach courses in German and English, respectively the willingness to learn the missing language to the required extent (at least B2 level within 2 years in the second language) for use in the context of university tasks.

Furthermore, relevant experience abroad and relevant non-university practice are desirable.

The University of Innsbruck is committed to increasing the proportion of women in academic positions, particularly in leadership roles, and explicitly encourages qualified women to apply. Where qualifications are equal, preference will be given to female candidates.

In accordance with the Collective Bargaining Agreement, professors are classified under remuneration group A1. The base salary for a full-time professorship is €6,604.30, paid 14 times per year. Depending on qualification and experience a higher salary and facilities may be negotiated with the Rector. - a CV detailing academic and professional background;
- a list of academic publications, lectures, and other scholarly work and projects, including third-party funded projects by indicating the own contribution, the type of funding acquisition (competitive/non-competitive), and the role in the application process;
- a description of completed, ongoing, and planned research;
- a teaching statement;
- and the five most relevant publications (papers attached as PDF).
