The Research Institute Brenner-Archives, together with the Research Center Digital Humanities, the Austrian Academy of Science and CLARIAH-AT, is pleased to announce the fourth workshop in the series "Data Analysis and Data Processing in the Humanities" on the topic of "Introduction to Process Mining". The workshop is aimed primarily at scholars without relevant experience.

**Process mining** attempts to identify patterns in a large amount of data describing processes and to analyze them. In principle, this technique can be applied very well to historical data, but process mining is also suitable for the analysis of communications (for example, in internet forums). The aim of the workshop is to explain the basics of process mining and, above all, to practise with examples.

On **8th and 18th June 2021**, Andrea Burattin (Department of Applied Mathematics and Computer Science, Technical University of Denmark) will lead the workshop. The first day will cover the basics and basal algorithms, and there will be a practical session on process mining. The second day will be an in-depth practical session on processing and analyzing data.

A computer with administrator privileges is required for the workshop (exact details on software to be announced). Workshop:

- Friday, 18th June from 9:00 to 13:00 online.

The workshop will be held in English.
