**Raymond Ammann**, born in Switzerland, studied in Basel, Bern, and Innsbruck, where he finished his habilitation in 2001. He lived in Melanesia for 15 years, where he conducted music-ethnological fieldwork. Since 2003 he is back in Europe, where he has had teaching engagements at various universities. Alongside a countless number of articles, CDs, and documentaries, he is also the author of multiple books on music and dance. Another of his areas of research is the music of the Polar Regions, to which he will give an introduction. Today, he is head of a research project on yodeling in Switzerland, affiliated with the University of Innsbruck.

**Rose Lynn Whidden** is a Canadian ethnomusicologist who did graduate work in music, anthropology, and folklore. She got her PhD in Montréal in 1987. Her extensive research among the Inuit has led to the publication of a multitude of articles, sound publications, and books on a variety of topics relating to Native music. She sees songs and music as a part of our environment and will show so in a multi-media event.
