### WHAT IS EDAP ABOUT?

EDAP is a high standard peer reviewed online series of scientific papers. Founded at the cradle of the enlarged European Union, namely on the 1st of May 2004, it stands for an increasing process of diversification within the European Union. The objective of EDAP is to contribute to the theoretical development and empirical exploration of various approaches to the growing reality of diversity embedded within Europe at large. Diversity is hereby understood in a broad sense as encompassing the diversity of ethnic identities, of cultures, of regions, of values and identities, of institutions and structures within Europe. Regionalism, federalism, minority protection, multiculturalism and more generally, „constitutional flexibility“, are therefore core topics that underpin EDAP's focus. In particular, EDAP focuses on diversity from the perspective of national constitutional law and EU law, political science, economics and sociology.

### WHO STANDS BEHIND EDAP?

EDAP is run by two research institutes situated at the European Academy in Bozen/Bolzano (EURAC), namely the Institute for Studies on Federalism and Regionalism and the Institute for Minority Rights. EURAC – a well established research institution active in five main research fields and occupying over 200 persons – is situated in South-Tyrol (Italy), one of the worlds most well known examples of a successful accommodation of diversity in a regional context.


## MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION

Submissions and communications are only accepted via email ([edap@eurac.edu](mailto:edap@eurac.edu)).

- Scholarly contributions from all relevant disciplines are welcome, but preference is given to papers discussing forms of diversity and autonomy from the perspective of comparative and EU constitutional law, political science and sociology.
- The length of the papers should be from around 4.000 up to around 15.000 words, including footnotes.
- In its peer review EDAP is applying a double blind system in order to guarantee a high quality of the EDAP papers. The decision on whether a paper is accepted for publication or not, is taken by the editorial board of EDAP.
- The editorial board accepts only those papers for further evaluation, which follow exactly the rules of quotation/ guidelines for authors and that either have been written by a mother tongue author or have undergone linguistic revision. EDAP does not provide for editing and formatting.
- Contributions in English, German and Italian are preferred, but publications in French and Spanish are also welcome.
- The authors are requested to provide a short CV (five lines ca), 3-5 keywords and a 200 word abstract in English. Despite the publication in EDAP the EDAP authors retain the copyright of their papers. In order to guarantee an efficient dissemination of research results, neither the parallel or previous nor the later publication in traditional journals or books is in contrast with the editorial policy. However, explicit reference to the publication in the EDAP Series, including a link to the respective URL, has to be guaranteed and authors should make sure that no copy rights of third parties are compromised. Subsequent publication of EDAP articles in other online sources is not allowed. Please note that it is not possible to remove papers from the EDAP archives in case of later publication elsewhere.
