

English for Law. UK and Europe **Nemeth 308.500**

Goal of the course	The goal of this course is to familiarise students whose native language is not English with basic legal terminology.
Contents	The course covers legal terminology regarding legal education, legal professions, sources of law, civil and criminal courts and procedure. Examples will be taken from the legal system of England and Wales as well as European Law.
Method	Half of the course will take place in class. The second half will be covered by online moduls. Please make sure you have a valid e-mail account and adequate internet access. You will have to download pictures and audio files. Participants will be asked to read assigned texts (cases, excerpts from textbooks etc.) and do online tests etc. in preparation for and in addition to each class. All material will be provided online and/or distributed in class.
Examination	The final grade shall be determined on the basis of oral participation, fulfilment of the online tasks as well as a written exam at the end of the course.
