Omnisubjectivity

In this talk I propose a new divine attribute I call omnisubjectivity. It is the property of having a complete and perfect grasp of every conscious state of every conscious being from the perspective of that being. I argue that omnisubjectivity is entailed by omniscience and by omnipresence, and is implied by common practices of Christian prayer. I defend it against the charge that God is morally sullied by too close a grasp of evil conscious states, and suggest that doctrines of grace and sanctification are enhanced by the existence of this attribute.

Linda Zagzebski ist George Lynn Cross Research Professor und Kingfisher College Chair of the Philosophy of Religion and Ethics an der University of Oklahoma. Sie war Präsidentin der American Catholic Philosophical Association und der Society of Christian Philosophers.
