Christian—Muslim Dialogue may be celebrated as today's prime problem solver and may be condemned to be the cause of a current confusion in issues of faith, values and identity. When stuck in an impasse, Jesuits tend to consult their tradition, their experiential way of facing challenges — nameley "Ignatian Spirituality". In the founding history of the Society of Jesus, Islam and dialogue (the adventure of constructive encounter) were at the horizon, but they were no determinant factors. However, the first Jesuits had an apostolic, cultural and scientific interest in the otherness of other believers. The lecture uses Ignatian key concepts and figures to develop criteria for a Christian-Muslim dialogue faithful to human reason, Church teaching and the testimony of Jesus.

Prof. DDr. Felix Körner, S.J. is one of the leading experts on Islam in the Catholic Church. Holding doctorates both in Islamic Studies (PhD, Bamberg) and Systematic Theology (S.T.D., Fribourg), Felix Körner now serves as a professor of dogmatics at the Theological Faculty of the Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome. His research interests are theology of interreligious dialogue and contemporary Islamic theology. Among his books are *Alter Text – Neuer Kontext. Koranhermeneutik in der Türkei heute*, Freiburg (Herder) ²2015, and *Kirche im Angesicht des Islam. Theologie des interreligiösen Zeugnisses*, Stuttgart (Kohlhammer) 2008.
