

Ulrich Heid (University of Hildesheim)

Ulrich Heid did studies of Romance Philology and History in Stuttgart, Valenciennes and Lille and got his PhD in Computational Linguistics at Universität Stuttgart, in 1996. He then was a Post-Doc at the FrameNet research at group at International Computer Science Institute (ICSI) in Berkeley, where he worked on operationalizations of frame semantic descriptions. After his Habilitation, he was responsible for several research projects at Universität Stuttgart, among others on terminology extraction from corpora or, within the Sonderforschungsbereich SFB 732, on the treatment of ambiguity in data extraction from corpora. Since 2010, he is a full professor of Computational Linguistics and Language Technology at Universität Hildesheim, where his research group focuses on corpora and e-dictionaries, as well as on the use of NLP techniques in Digital Humanities. He was a dean of the faculty of linguistics and information science at Hildesheim from 2017 to 2023.
