With this brochure I invite you to explore our university by the numbers. Without a doubt our students, faculty and staff continued to show strength and achieve excellence in teaching, learning and research.

Significant progress and exceptional accomplishments have been made in key priority areas by our community. As an illustration, through collaborative efforts, we achieved the publication of approximately 1,500 articles in leading international journals (of which 81% are freely available online) and secured over 72 million euros in external funding in 2023. The high appeal to international students (51%) and a share of almost 69% of publications in Web of Science with international co-authors are a remarkable testament to our university's international focus and recognition.

An exciting first year lies behind the new Rectorate of the University of Innsbruck. We are convinced that together with all members of our university we will succeed in consolidating the role of our alma mater as one of the largest and best performing educational institutions in Austria.



Nationality of newly enrolled students






Graduates Academic year 2022/23 per faculty






Gender ratio of graduates in 2022/23









Professors per student




