As an illustration, through collaborative efforts, we achieved the publication of approximately 1,500 articles in leading international journals and secured over 63 million euros in external funding in 2022. The high appeal to international students (49.4\%) and international researchers (47.2\%) is a remarkable testament to our university's international focus and recognition.
