The Iron Age cemetery of Chiavari (prov. Genova)

The cemetery of Chiavari (ending 8th-early 6th cent. BC) is one of the most important complexes of the early Iron Age not only in Liguria, but in all northwestern Italy. Its monumental burials, including round and rectangular lithic sepultures, are divided in three areas. The tomb groups comprehend few clay vases, but the status of the deceased is indicated by metallic artefacts, as fibulas, weapons, razors and ornaments. The community, which was having relationships with Etruria and other Italic regions, was a complex society with a protourban development.

Silvia Paltineri received her PhD at the University of Pavia in 2006, with a dissertation about the cemetery of Chiavari, published in 2010. Currently she is giving lectures about Etruscology at the University of Padua and about Archaeology of preroman Italy at the University of Pavia.
