***New researches on pre-roman Adriatic cemeteries: Verucchio***



*New researches in the necropolis Lippi at Verucchio produced further data and information on this center overlooking the Adriatic coast flourished from 9<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> century B.C. Verucchio is a strategic center to control the trade routes and with a key role in the spread throughout the Italian peninsula of Baltic amber. The Villanovan center was characterized by four cemeteries that have unearthed around 600 tombs, almost exclusively with the funeral rite of cremation, having some structural variety and rich grave goods. The funerary objects are in exceptional preservation, especially regarding organic materials, such as wool, linen, wood and wicker.*

Annalisa Pozzi received an MA at the *Università degli Studi di Bologna* and a PhD in Archeology at the *Università degli Studi di Padova*. She is actually in charge as archaeologist at the Soprintendenza per i Beni Archeologici dell'Emilia Romagna (Bologna). She is interested in the First and Second Iron Age and she studies the Villanovan centre of Verucchio.
