New researches on pre-roman Adriatic cemeteries: Novilara



Novilara is a large Picene necropolis, settled on a small hill facing the Adriatic sea, first explored in the late 19th century by Edoardo Brizio. During those excavations more than 250 graves with skeletons and grave goods have been found. In 2012-2013, parallel with road works for a nearby highway, new archaeological fieldworks have been carried out, discovering further 150 tombs dating to 8th-7th century B.C. The data analysis of the new excavation is still going on.

Chiara Delpino was born in Rome in 1977. She studied at *La Sapienza* University of Rome, where she also attended the post-graduate School of Specialisation in Archaeology. In 2006 she completed her PhD in Archaeology at *L'Orientale* University of Naples, discussing a research focused on an Ancient Neolithic Italian settlement. At present, she is in charge as archaeologist at the Italian Ministry of Cultural Heritage.
