Latin inscriptions in the former Jesuit church in Poznań



In 1571, the Jesuits came to Poznań in west-central Poland where, in the course of time, they built a monastery, a church, and a college. After the suppression of the Society of Jesus, all buildings changed their functions, but the church (now the Parish Church) still looks as if the monks had never left it.



The vast majority of paintings, frescos, sculptures, and other kinds of decoration have remained unchanged since the 18th century. The same goes for the rich epigraphical material that consists of almost two hundred Latin inscriptions of different forms and contents. The goal of the lecture is to present some interesting examples of the inscriptions and to discuss some difficult and unexplained issues.
